Financial Report - Dan Watt, Treasurer



Our income and expenses for YTD August 2013 were as follows:

Contributions through August 2013 \$148,249 Expenses through August 2013 130,034 Budgeted income and expenses 158,401

Our income for the first eight months of 2013 has remained ahead of our ex-

pectations. Our expenses trailed the budgeted level by just under \$59,000. A significant portion of the "below-budget expenses" was due to the lack of pastor and associated costs. A detailed report of this info is posted on the bulletin board across from the fellowship hall.

Our mortgage has been reduced to \$539,196, which is still a major burden, amounting to 35% of our spending. We do have a mortgage reduction fund if anyone wishes to donate extra money to that purpose. We are about to begin a new and exciting chapter in the history of St. Andrew and are in decent financial condition. We do have to be aware that our 2013 pledge level will not meet expected expenditures in 2014, so our excitement will need to reach into our pockets a little deeper to maintain our financial state.

The following items are highlights from the September 12, 2013, Stated Session Meeting:

Members from the Committee on Ministry met with the Session to conduct an exit interview on the Rev. Mel Strain. The consensus was that Mel had done a very good job, leading and preaching during his time at St. Andrew.

The minutes for the Stated Session Meeting of June 13, 2013, the Called Meeting of August 6, 2013, and the Congregational Meeting of August 25, 2013 were approved.

Our membership remains at 126 as of August 31, 2013

The Session reviewed copies of our Sexual Misconduct Policy which, after a more detailed review by our Personnel Committee Chair (Harold Culbert), our Clerk of Session (Stu Strong), and our new pastor (Rev. Toby Mueller), we expect to approve at our next Stated Session Meeting.

The Session gave approval for the chaplain of Alacare, Harold Fanning, to conduct a memorial service for Juanita Kuykendall at St. Andrew on Tuesday, September 24, 2013.

The Session called for a congregational meeting to be held after the worship service on Sunday, October 6, 2013, for the purpose of hearing a report from the nominating committee and electing a class of elders and a trustee for the Class of 2016.

Peacemaking Offering



St. Andrew will receive the Peacemaking Offering on World Communion Sunday, <u>October 6, 2013</u>. The Peacemaking Offering is one of the four special offerings of the PC(USA). It supports the peacemaking efforts of congregations, presbyteries, synods and the General Assembly. Twenty-five percent of the offering remains in the congregation to support its peacemaking efforts, 25% goes to presbytery and synod efforts, and 50% supports the work of the Presby-

terian Peacemaking Program. The Presbyterian Peacemaking Program uses its share of the offering to assist the congregations and the other governing bodies of the denomination do peacemaking.

Dinner will be potluck and will begin at 6:00 p.m. Please join us, bring along a dish to share, and make the members of our sister churches feel welcome. The presentation by Wilhelm Pierola Iturralde will start at 6:30 p.m.

Wilhelm, a civil engineer, is the founder of the Center for Regional Development. He has worked in Central and South America to improve working condi-

tions and the environment. He is the president of the Bolivian Joining Hands Network, which works with the PCUSA Hunger Program. His family lives in the world's highest city, Potosi, Bolivia. Chenoa Stock will accompany Wilhelm and serve as translator. She has worked as a Young Adult Volunteer in India, with the Presbyterian Hunger Program in Sri Lanka following the tsunami there and is now in Bolivia. A graduate of Wittenberg University, she is the daughter of retired Presbyterian co-pastors.
