*now,* without even considering it may not even be God's will especially in our prayers. We can rest assured if we have faith in God and a committed relationship with Him, He will ALWAYS give us what we NEED and not always what we want. But, it's more than just desires of wants or needs, the key is to understand that God is God and we are not and that His timing is not the same as ours.

#### **Financial Report**

Our income and expenses for YTD July 2013 were as follows:

Our income for the first five months of 2013 was ahead of our expectations. Our expenses trailed the budgeted level by just over \$19,000. A significant portion of the "below-budget expenses" was due to the lack of a pastor and the associated costs. Also, we received a check for \$42,619 from our insurance company for an initial payment toward the roof replacement. A detailed report of this information is posted on the bulletin board across from the fellowship hall.

Our mortgage has been reduced to \$542,718 which is still a major burden, amounting to 31% of our spending. We do have a mortgage reduction fund, if anyone wishes to donate extra money for that purpose.

We have received notice that



our insurance premium is going to rise by about \$1,100 per year. We have been assured that this had nothing to do with our roof. Two other carriers were checked for quotes but were even higher than our increased premium. We will start an earlier search for comparisons next year.
