From the Pastor ...

On defining 'Christian', Frederick Buechner writes, "Jesus said, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me' (John 14:6). He didn't say that any particular ethic, doctrine, or religion was the way, the truth, and the life. He said that he was. He didn't say that it was by believing or doing anything in particular that you could 'come to the Father.' He said that it was only by him – by living, participating in, being caught up by the way of life that he embodied, that was his way." (Wishful Thinking, p. 16)

Lent is a serious season for Christians, typically a time to reflect on our own walks with Jesus. The 3-D Rule of Life, which I outlined during the 2/23 worship service, is one great way of becoming more intentional about your own walk of faith. In addition, we have several worship services planned for Lent, beginning with the traditional Ash Wednesday service. This will be on March 5 at 6:30pm, in lieu of the usual Wednesday supper and study. No supper, but the next day, Thursday, March 6, we will have the usual supper and study, and our guest speaker will be Marilyn Borst, from the Outreach Foundation, to



speak more about her work with pastors and elders in the Middle East. Marilyn led our delegation to Syria and Lebanon this past January.

Another opportunity for group study will begin Tuesday, March 11, and continue each Tuesday morning for an hour at 10:30am. We will walk through the final few chapters of the gospel of Luke, as we prepare for Holy Week. The Wednesday evening studies will also center around Lenten themes, in particular, 'Seeing Ourselves in those Confronted by Jesus.'

Let us all endeavor to get 'caught up in the way of life that [Jesus] embodied', as Buechner writes. And I hope you invite a friend!

Financial Report

Our income and expenses for YTD January 2014 were as follows:

Contributions for January YTD 2014\$16,635

Expenses for January 2014 YTD\$17,749

Budgeted income & expenses\$19,320

Our income for the first month of 2014 has tracked our pledged income pretty closely. Our expenses trailed the budgeted level by just over \$1500. We still have some unknowns concerning our losses from the break-in, but it will probably be our deductible of \$1000. A detailed report of this information is posted on the bulletin board across from the fellowship hall.

Activities around our church have picked up speed and you can find people at the building most any day. The Session has decided to use some of our accumulated Memorial Funds for adding electronic projection to our education aids. This will be primarily for the Bible Study time on Wednesday but will be available for Sunday School classes as well. Also approved was a collection fund for "Designated Missions", with the first one being the food kits for Syrian refugees. Exciting times! Don't miss out on all of the action.

The following are highlights from the February 17, 2014 Stated Session Meeting

- 1. Due to scheduling conflicts, there was no Stated Session Meeting in January 2014.
- 2. Rev. Mueller opened the meeting with a prayer and a study on Transformational Leaders, Chapter 2: Worship.
- 3. Our membership is at 123 as of January 31, 2014.
- 4. The Session confirmed an earlier email decision to designate February 9, 2014 as Scout Sunday and approved the use of our facility for the Cub Scout Blue and Gold Banquet on February 22, 2014.
- 5. We have been notified by Probate Judge Greg Cain that our facility will no longer be used as a polling place due to consolidation of polling places resulting from redistricting.
- 6. The minutes for the Stated Meeting of December 16, 2013 were approved as amended and the minutes of the Congregational Meeting of January 5, 2014 were approved as distributed.
- 7. The Session approved the 2013 Statistical Report and it was submitted to North Alabama Presbytery.
- 8. Numerous approvals were given for the use of our facility to Decatur Music Club, AlaCare Hospice and to members for family gatherings. See the church calendar for details.
- 9. Turner Matthews distributed his report of the Winter Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery which was held on Saturday, February 15, 2014 at Fellowship Presbyterian Church in Huntsville.






Easter Lilies
